I was a member of the Rainbow Chamber in the 1990's when I had a law office in Sacramento, Deos & McGill. I am not currently a member.

3. Describe how you would support/oppose the use of programs to ensure equal opportunities, policies, laws, and/or ordinances that protect LGBT individuals in the workplace.

If elected, I would be the first LGBT member of the Davis City Council. I would continue to mentor LGBT youth and be a positive role model for youth going thinking about working in politics and/or opening their own business. We have zero tolerance policies in Davis and I would continue to be a voice for our LGBT community.

4. What are the most pressing issues facing our region, and how do you propose we resolve them?

The most pressing issue here in Davis, and in the region, is sufficient affordable housing for working families, seniors, and students. I believe we need to build more multi-unit housing developments and build smaller homes that are affordable be design. Davis is also struggling to bring in economic development. I intend to work with UC Davis to develop more of a food and agriculture centric model that would support start ups and local businesses.

5. What is your vision to attract major business/Fortune 500 companies into our region?

We need to advertise our region's cultural diversity, access to political power, our world class universities, and proximity to the delights of the Sierras, and wine country.

6. Share your vision to make our region a better place for small businesses.

The key to economic development is supporting the creation of more small businesses. We can do this through incentives such as adjusting impact fees for start-ups, interest free loans, and/or lowered or no rent for the first year.
